Nothing but the Blood of Jesus

I remember vividly an incident that happened at my previous congregation. Just before Lent began, a large, black spot of some unknown substance was discovered just outside the entrance to the church on the sidewalk. Our property guy took it upon himself to get rid of it, and he threw every cleaning solution known to man at it.

Nothing worked. Not soap and water. Not acetone. Not vinegar, or CLR, or ammonia. Nothing. All of his work; all of his effort resulted in nothing. That black spot welcomed guest and member alike for a very, very long time.

I included this member's work on that spot in my Ash Wednesday sermon that year because it was a stark reminder of our futile efforts to remove sin from our own lives. Sin begins with a heart that is turned inwards on itself; a desire to be our own little god. We are born into this state, and we literally need an outside force—very much like a heart surgeon, to fix our hearts and wash away the stain of our sin.

The season of Lent reminds us that Jesus is that surgeon—the Great Physician who comes into this world to change us; to cleanse us; to wipe the stain of our sin away. And the solvent that he uses is his holy and precious blood poured out at the cross of Calvary. It removes every stain and makes us holy and righteous. As we enter this holy season and progress to the cross and resurrection, let us remember what truly makes us clean: nothing but the blood of Jesus.






