GriefShare – from Mourning into Joy

For the fourth year Bethany Lutheran Church is hosting a free grief support workshop for the community called GriefShare. Classes will begin on <u>Thursday</u>, January 9, and will be held each Thursday from 10:00 a.m. - noon.

Pastor Ray Tiemann, Visitation Pastor at Bethany, and a team of trained lay leaders will facilitate the 14 sessions that are part of this program, which end on April 10. Participants can register or get more information by calling (830-997-2069) or emailing (churchofficeblc@gmail.com) the church office. Or, come to the first class on January 9 and see if this is right for you.

During the two-hour session each week, the class will watch a short video and engage in group conversation. Each participant receives a personal workbook to help them continue their thinking and praying between sessions. Part of the group covenant assures complete confidentiality in the conversations.

Pastor Tiemann said, "This class is designed to provide grieving persons with sustained support and helps them turn mourning into joy." Persons can join the class at any time. Also, the videos are available online if someone should miss a week.

The new Preschool will increase the number of classrooms that will double student enrollment and will offer care for infants as young as 6 weeks old, as well as afterschool care for children up to the age of 12. This is truly a community project as 85% of students enrolled at Bethany Preschool are not members of Bethany Lutheran Church.

Campaign Chairman, Jody Donovan said, "We are blessed and grateful to be as far along as we are but need some others to dig deep in their pockets and get us over the line." Donations can be made by check payable to Bethany Preschool Building Bright Futures, charitable donations from IRAs to avoid taxes, cash, or online at BethanyFBG.com.

Over \$5.19 Million Pledged or Donated to Building Bright Futures

Affordable, quality childcare is not a new issue for Fredericksburg. A 2023 sur-

vey of employers conducted by the Fredericksburg Chamber of Commerce revealed 97% of local businesses have employees with young children and more than60% reported staff disruptions—on a weekly or monthly basis—caused by childcare availability problems.

Bethany Preschool plans to tackle this issue by building a new, bigger, state-of-the-art preschool building. The capital campaign that Bethany Preschool has launched is called Building Bright Futures. It is doing well but needs a little more help.

With generous donations received from the Bethany Lutheran Church congregation of over \$2 million and local organizations like Create Healthy, St. Vincent de Paul Society of St. Mary's Church and many others, we are close to 75% of our goal of \$7 million with over \$5.19 million pledged or donated. So, we only need \$2 million more!

There is currently \$500,000 in matching grants for businesses and individuals that can donate to the project and double their impact before March of 2025.

Bethany's Preschool has been in continuous operation for more than 40 years, offering families from across Gillespie County and Kerrville quality childcare and appropriate early childhood education.



The organizations receiving grants this year are: Cross Trails Ministry, The Good Samaritan Center, Heart of the Hills Pregnancy Resources, Salvation Army of Fbg, VFW Post 7105, Wounded Warriors at Nebo, Willow City Volunteer Fire and Rescue, Vereins Quilt Guild of Fbg, Mercy Gate Ministries, Bethany WELCA, Living Well Learning Center, Hill Country Community Needs Council, Little Hearts Child Development Center, FISD Education Foundation, Gillespie County Historical Society, and the Texas Ramp Project.

Since 2008, the Foundation has distributed \$539,206. The investment balance as of November 30, 2024, is \$809,591.

Bethany Lutheran Foundation Distributes 2024 Grants

The Foundation was formed in 2007 with a generous gift to our church from the estate of Alma Braeutigam

of \$642,331. Our equally generous congregation decided to convert this one-time gift to a perpetual fund that supports not only our church, but also our preschool, and community organizations. Each year, since 2008, 5% of our annual investment balance has been distributed to BLC (25%), BPS (25%), and community organizations (50%). August 1st through September 15th is the grant submission process. The Ministry and Mission Committee than reviews all applications and decides which organizations will receive grants and how much they will receive.

For 2024, a total of \$35,000 has been distributed. On December 5th, the recipient organizations were presented with their checks for a total of \$17,500. On December 15th, BLC and BPS each received their checks for \$8,750 during church services.

Constance & Jim Schultz

After relocating from Houston in 2007 Jim and Constance Schultz joined Bethany. - 1. Our first Christmas Journey performance was in December of 2001, making December of 2024 our 24th year. We have only been rained out once in 48 nights of presentation.
- 2. In the early days, several men spent 2 days chain sawing cedar (Ashe Juniper), several ladies spent many hours using loppers to cut the boughs, and then the set-up crew created the pathway by placing the boughs, each overlapping the previous one so no wooden stem would show. Finally, strings of white lights were placed atop the cedar.
- 3. Margaret Hannum and Cole Lewis painted almost all the original backdrops, and those backdrops are still in use today. Those backdrops have been rained on, sleeted on, and wind whipped. The fact that they remain beautiful and functional is a testament to the care that the Christmas Journey leaders, the scene captains, and the set-up and tear-down crews have shown for all 24 years. There have been years when the scenes had to be takaen down in light rain and then dried in a controlled environment before they could be returned to storage.
